

# CDAS - Chairman's Monthly Letter - November 2018

## **Fieldwork**

## **Petworth Survey**

We had a successful survey of the area around the Doric Temple in the Pleasure Gardens. Both Resistivity and Magnetometry surveys were conducted with good results.

The surveys revealed some responses that correspond to pathways on the 1897 Ordnance Survey Map that are no longer in use. There were also responses that do not correspond to features on the 1897 Map.

We have speculated based on the views on LiDAR and the two surveys that the area in front of the Doric Temple may have once been an amphitheatre. An intermediate report has been sent to Tom Dommett of the National Trust and he is very pleased with our findings. A full report will follow.

#### Franklin Place Excavation

Following on from an earlier survey of the back garden of a house in Franklin Place that was once a pub we made a small excavation on the site of a possible well. As it turned out it was not a well but a partial infill of the ditch that ran around the Chichester walls during Roman times. Much of what we recovered from the trench was 19<sup>th</sup> Century or post WW2 but we did find one sherd of Rowlands Castle grey ware.

#### **Thorney Island**

Anne de Potier led a small group of CDAS Members who cleared vegetation from pillbox CH013 on the West side of Thorney. It had become very overgrown but now looks good as new. The before and after photos on Facebook look quite striking.

Later that day we investigated some striations which show up on the Environment Agency LiDAR on land to the north of the pillbox. We had a thought that they might be part of a ridge and furrow farming system. The site visit confirmed this and it will now be added by James Kenny to the Historic Environment Record. Surviving ridge and furrow systems are relatively rare in West Sussex and this is a good find.

On the same day in the area around the point closest to CH013 we found worked flints, further north we found a sample of probable Bronze Age briquetage. Similar finds have been recorded previously confirming that this area should systematically investigated.
